



ECAT'S TRADE AND INVESTMENT REPORT FOR THE 109TH CONGRESS

November 2, 2006

ECAT and its member companies recognize that the expansion of trade and investment is a critical component of a healthy U.S. and world economy and actively advocate policies, international agreements and legislative measures that support stronger U.S. participation in the global economy. Congress plays a crucial role in trade expansion through numerous avenues, from the promotion and implementation of trade agreements and the passage or rejection of legislative trade and investment measures, to work in promoting ambitious outcomes to particular negotiations and providing leadership on spurring more robust U.S. participation in the global economy.

During the 109th Congress, Representatives and Senators have had numerous opportunities to vote in support of expanded trade and investment and to reject measures that would impose unnecessary trade barriers. At the same time, many Members of the 109th Congress – both Republican and Democrat and oftentimes working across party lines – have played essential roles in supporting progress in the Doha Development Agenda (DDA) of the World Trade Organization (WTO), in helping to create momentum for a strong, forward-looking U.S. agenda to expand our trade and investment with countries throughout the world and in rejecting unnecessary barriers to trade and investment. *ECAT's Trade and Investment Report for the 109th Congress* focuses on a number of legislative votes, but also recognizes the other important contributions to trade and investment made by Members of the 109th Congress.

Legislative Votes Supporting Trade and Investment Liberalization¹

For ECAT, the defining trade and investment votes of the 109th Congress and ECAT's position were:²

In examining the record of Representatives and Senators from both sides of the aisle on these votes, ECAT is pleased to report that there is continued and often robust Congressional support for trade and investment liberalization policies and reluctance, frequently on key votes, to support measures that

would place undue barriers on such trade and investment. Nevertheless, several findings indicate the need for redoubled efforts to explain the enormous benefits the United States and its citizens enjoy from expanded international trade and investment, including:

- the closeness of many of these votes, particularly in the House;
- the number of trade-restricting pieces of legislation offered; and
- strong levels of opposition to all key trade-liberalizing measures particularly by Members in the Senate.

On these votes, 22 percent of Senators and six percent of Representatives voted in support of trade liberalization policies on each and every measure. Forty-one percent of Senators and 33 percent of Representatives voted in support of trade liberalization policies more than 80 percent of the time. On the other side of the spectrum, 24 percent of Senators and one percent of Representatives voted against trade liberalization 100 percent of the time.

Notably, 45.5 percent of Senators (46 Members) and 43 percent of Representatives (186 Members) supported all of the free trade agreements (FTAs) voted upon during the 109th Congress (DR-CAFTA and the Oman FTA in the Senate and DR-CAFTA and the Oman and Bahrain FTAs in the House). The lists of 100 percent supporters of FTAs, a more detailed description of the votes analyzed, ECAT's methodology and member-by-member voting data are found in the attachments to this report.

Additional Support for Trade and Investment Liberalization

In addition to legislative votes, a number of Members of Congress stand out for their additional work in supporting stronger U.S. participation in the global economy. Such work includes promoting:

- A strong and trade-liberalizing outcome in the WTO Doha Development Agenda negotiations;
- Negotiation and passage of trade liberalizing FTAs and other trade and investment agreements;³
- Adoption of WTO-consistent measures and rejection of distorting trade and investment barriers at home;⁴ and
- Stronger trade and investment ties with the least developed regions and countries around the world, including Africa and Haiti.⁵

³Work in this area includes efforts to promote FTA negotiations with Korea and Malaysia and leadership in promoting Congressional passage of FTAs with the Dominican Republic and Central America, Oman and Bahrain, as well as other trade and investment measures, including permanent normal trade relations with Ukraine and the U.S.-Uruguay Bilateral Investment Treaty.

⁴Work in this area includes efforts to: dismantle the WTO-illegal Continued Dumping and Subsidy Offset Act (CDSOA); seek reforms to the trade remedy laws that reflect commercial reality and eliminate unnecessary barriers to trade; reform in a positive and non-investment distorting manner the process for national security reviews of foreign investments in the United States; and oppose WTO-illegal and distortive trade barriers against China and other countries.

Conclusion

In examining the record of Representatives and Senators on both votes and other trade- and investment-related activities, ECAT finds that there is continued and often strong Congressional support from both sides of the aisle for a wide variety of trade and investment liberalization policies. There are numerous champions in both the House and Senate – Republicans and Democrats oftentimes working together – supporting robust U.S. participation in the global economy and actively opposing the maintenance or imposition of unnecessary and distortive trade and investment barriers at home. Nevertheless, the closeness of many of these votes, the numerous pieces of legislation that would limit, rather than expand, U.S. participation in the global economy and strong opposition to key trade liberalization measures indicate the need for redoubled efforts to explain the enormous benefits the United States and its citizens, businesses and farmers enjoy from expanded international trade and investment.

Key Votes of the U.S. Senate

H.R. 5684: United States-Oman Free Trade Agreement Implementation Act

Legislation to implement the United States-Oman Free Trade Agreement, a comprehensive market-opening agreement that will provide new economic opportunities and strengthen the partnership between the United States and Oman.

Passed by a vote of 62-to-32 on September 19, 2006

Amendment No. 1663 to S. 1665: Dorgan Trade Remedy Negotiation Amendment

Amendment to H.R. 2862 Fiscal Year 2006 (Departments of Commerce and Justice, Science, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act) to prohibit any negotiation in the WTO of changes to U.S. trade remedy laws (anti-dumping, countervailing duty and safe-guard laws).

Amendment No. 424 to H.R. 3058: Rangel Amendment to Lift Cuba Economic Embargo

Methodological End Notes

Presence in Congress: Only Members currently in the House and Senate are included in ECAT's analysis. Members who have left Congress completely during the 109th Congress are, therefore, not included in any individual analysis, nor are their votes considered in the calculation of overall percentages of support for key trade and investment liberalization measures.

One Missed Vote: Members who missed one of the designated key votes are evaluated only on the votes actually taken. The overall percentage scores of Members who have missed one vote are considered in the overall analysis of the percentage of Members supporting key trade and investment liberalization measures.

Members missing up-to-one vote, but otherwise having a perfect record are included in all calculations and listed by name in the "100-percent support" category.

Members missing one vote and otherwise having a score of 0 percent based on the other votes actually taken are identified with that score in the full listing of the records of House and Senate Members on the designated key votes. Such Members are not, however, identified by name in the "0-percent support" lists of House and Senate Members included in the body of the report.

Multiple Missed Votes: Members who missed more than one of the designated key votes are not given an overall percentage score, although their votes are listed in the full listing of the records of House and Senate Members on the designated key votes.
